The OKI-NI-SOO-KA-WA experience is rooted in faith, community, service, and social justice. Participants will live in community in a simple and safe setting. Each day involves service, reflection and prayer. Students are challenged to explore and discuss a variety of social justice, economic, religious and human rights issues.

Selection Criteria:

- Students entering 10th, 11th or 12th grade for the 2015-16 school year
- Good academic standing
- Good attendance and behavior record
- Family is current with tuition
- Exhibits a personal and educational interest in travel. (sense of responsibility, capacity for adjusting to new and unique situations, ability to get along with others, strong character, motivation, and creativity)
- Good ambassador for DeLaSalle High School

Cost to the family for participation: \$400

What is included in the cost? Travel via Amtrak, ground transportation, cultural activities, room and board

What is not included in the cost? Personal expenses and medical insurance
