Prospective Students Invited to Entrance Exam

Saturday, January 16, 8:30-11:30am



All 8th grade students who wish to attend DeLaSalle are required to take the [Entrance Exam](#). Families do NOT need to preregister for the exam. Students must register in the Albers Atrium anytime between 8:00–8:25am. Once we have enough students to fill the first classroom, we will begin administering the exam. The last classroom will begin no later than 8:30am. We charge no fee for the exam and we will provide all test materials,

including pencils.

While students are taking the Entrance Exam, we invite parents to stay for a Parent Information Seminar in the Florance Center, where we will cover information about the application and registration process, financial aid, transportation, student life, uniforms, and more.

Students who cannot take the Entrance Exam on January 16 should contact the Office of Admission at 612.676.7605 to arrange a make-up exam time.
