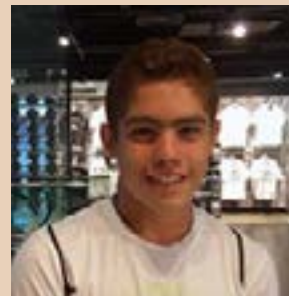

## Class of 2020 Honors Mastery Exams Offered May 7

Incoming 9th graders who wish to be placed in an accelerated or honors level of courses as a 9th grader must take and pass an Honors Mastery Exam in the subject. Mastery exams are offered Saturday May 7 in Geometry, Spanish, French, Chinese, and Science; each exam lasts up to 55 minutes. The Science placement exam will be offered at 9:00-10:00am.
